In September, we were awarded 501(c) 3 status by the IRS. We never thought it would happen this quickly; but all donations to Global Cane Outreach are now federally tax deductible. We are still awaiting approval from the Franchise Tax Board in California to be granted state tax exemption.


Also in September, Bevie traveled with Ritch & Joann Cureton and Char De La Torre to Cajamarca Peru. Wow, Peru was great! We had the opportunity to bless some blind people, love on some kids at an orphanage and work with the local missionaries; who have several programs for serving their community. We had two days for cane training and were able to train the local missionaries as well as 11 blind people from the area. All also received solar powered audio Bibles in Spanish. It is hard to describe what a wonderful feeling it is to have been a part of this experience. The opportunity to give to others what the blind get so easily in this country was very rewarding, but the opportunity to share the gospel with them was an even greater privilege. Needless to say, there were a lot of happy people at the end of our training times. Many thanks to all of our supporters for helping make this trip happen. After we left Peru, the missionaries we trained were able to train four more people without sight and gave them canes and audio Bibles. Currently, we are in the process of sending more audio Bibles and canes to Peru.



In late October, Guy Crook left for Mexico. He and his interpreter met Macario; "a blind man in a small Mexican town about two hundred miles south of the border. He had been going blind since childhood. At first, he told Guy he would feel his way about with a piece of wire. When Guy met him, he had a well-worn child-sized cane. When Guy explained to him that the short cane could not give him information far enough in front of him, he confessed that more than once he had fallen on his face in a pile of rocks because of this very fact. He was delighted to receive a brand new cane, properly sized for his body, and listened intently as he gave instructions on how to use it." Guy reports that the high point of the trip for him was when they gave a solar charged audio Bible to Macario. Guy tells us: "as he was learning how to use it, he broke into tears saying that he had been dreaming of something like this for twenty-five years and now he had it right there in his hand; the talking Word of God, that he could access whenever he wanted." Praise God for His timing in this special gift!

Also in October, we welcomed Michael Graham to the Board of Directors for Global Cane Outreach. Michael brings a wealth of knowledge and experience to the team. Michael is a committed man of God, who has actively sought to bring the love of Christ throughout the world. Michael, himself is blind, and has spent his career working in the fields of counseling, training, and administrative work for those whom are visually impaired or blind. We are truly blessed to welcome him onto the board of directors.
